

Brig. Gen. (Ret) Christopher Dziubek enlisted as a field artillery cannon crewman in the US Army Reserve in 1986 and commissioned in 1990 into the Regular Army at Fort Rucker, Alabama. Over the course of 16 years in the reserve and 17 years on active duty he served in staff positions at the tactical, operational and strategic levels and in troop leadership roles as an Aeroscout and Attack Helicopter Platoon leader, Company Commander of Engineer and Civil Affairs units, Engineer Battalion Executive Officer and Commander, Civil Affairs Battalion and Brigade Commander and concluded his 33 year Army career as the

commanding general of the 351st CACOM.

His overseas combat, humanitarian and security cooperation tours include Tikrit, Ramadi, and Mosul Iraq, Dominican Republic, the Republic of Korea, and the Horn of Africa

Dziubek is a 1989 graduate of the University of Dayton, earning a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science, and holds two masters degrees, one in Education from the University of Toledo, and one in Strategic Studies from the U.S. Army War College.
