

## **Colonel Leonard J. DeFrancisci (Ret)**

Colonel Leonard J. DeFrancisci retired from the Marine Corps Reserves in February 2018 with 32 years. His last assignment was the Deputy Commander of the Force Headquarters Group, a subordinate command of the Marine Forces Reserve. Previously, Colonel DeFrancisci served as the Commanding Officer of 2d Civil Affairs Group and 4<sup>th</sup> Civil Affairs Group. He also served as detachment commander, operations officer and team leader at 4<sup>th</sup> CAG. In 2008-09, Colonel DeFrancisci served as the J9 for United States Forces Korea Det 102. He also served in Direct Support Motor Transport Company

A, 6<sup>th</sup> Motor Transport Battalion. Prior to that, he served as the anti-armor platoon commander, heavy machine gun platoon commander and the fire support coordinator for Weapons Company, 2d Battalion, 25<sup>th</sup> Marines. He also served as the operations officer and platoon commander for 4<sup>th</sup> Force Reconnaissance Company. His first assignment was weapons platoon commander and rifle platoon commander with 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, 3d Marines. He is a graduate of Army Ranger school.

Colonel DeFrancisci is a partner at DEMACO, a designer and manufacturer of high-capacity industrial food equipment, with a specialty in the pasta industry. DEMACO makes machines for companies such as Campbell's, Nestle (Stouffers), General Mills, ConAgra (Chef Boyardee), Amy's, Frito-Lay, PepsiCo and Kraft Heinz. He holds several patents. He is also the History Chair of the National Pasta Association and a regular contributor to *Professional Pasta* magazine. He volunteers as the President for the Space Coast Machinist Apprenticeship Program, a non-profit that coordinates and supervises the training of machinist apprentices throughout the Space Coast region of Florida.
